# CAMP RULES

## **DORMITORIES:**

1. Campers must be inside their dorms and lights must be turned out by designated times. No one is to be outside the dorms after lights out without permission.
2. Boys are not permitted to linger around the girls' dormitories, and girls are not permitted to linger around the boys' dormitories.
3. Each church is required to sweep the floor, make up beds, carry out trash and straighten the area in which they are staying before morning services at 9:30.
4. Churches staying in a certain area will be responsible for cleaning the bathroom in that area to avoid losing points from dorm inspection.
5. Government regulations forbid the use of fire inside dormitories. This means no fireworks or potential fire-causing devices.

## **DRESS:**

### **Girls:**

Dresses and culottes must be below the knee and should look and flow like a skirt.

- A. No pants, gauchos, or capris.
- B. No dresses or skirts with slits above the knee.
- C. No sundresses of any kind.

### **Boys:**

Wear a collared shirt to evening chapel services.

No skinny jeans.

### **All Campers:**

- A. Must wear shoes when outside the dormitory. Additionally, campers must remain in modest apparel at all times.
- B. Dress your best for evening services.
- C. Must maintain proper dress codes & conform to camp standards for apparel on and off ball fields and in skits presented in talent competitions.
- D. Absolutely no shorts of any style will be allowed on the campgrounds.
- E. No tee shirts with suggestive pictures or words.
- F. No sleeveless, mesh, or midriff tops or low-cut tops.

## **GENERAL**

1. Do not throw trash on the grounds. Use trash cans.
2. No drinks or food will be allowed in the chapel at any time.
3. After dark, all campers must stay in lighted areas.
4. No physical contact between boy and girl campers.
5. All campers, unless sick, must attend all morning devotions, lessons, morning and evening services, and sit in the chapel.
6. No camper will be allowed to cut in line. Campers must be in line at serving time. When the line has ended, the kitchen will be closed, and no meals will be served.
7. Bad sportsmanship on the part of any camper may cause their team to lose points.
8. No throwing of rocks or other objects at any time.
9. Skateboards, rollerblades, scooters, etc. are to be left at home.
10. No water balloons or squirt guns may be brought to camp.
11. No campers may drive while at camp.
12. Camp age children may not have electronic equipment at camp. (This includes cell phones, iPads, iPods, and handheld games as well as other such devices.)

## **SWIMMING POOL**

1. No camper is to be in the swimming area unless lifeguards or supervisors are present.
2. All campers must be fully clothed in dry clothing when going to and from the pool.
3. No after-hours swimming.
4. No camera in the swimming pool area.
5. T-shirts must be worn over swimsuits by boys and girls at all times in the pool area.

# COUNSELORS

Each church must provide responsible counselors for their own campers, an adult lady for the girl campers and an adult man for the boy campers.

1. All counselors are at camp to work and should be willing to accept responsibilities.
2. If at any time on the campground you see young people breaking the rules, you are to correct them even if they are not from your church.
3. Upon arriving at camp, do not move into a room unless you have talked to the camp registrar and know for sure where you are to stay.
4. At the time of check-in you should turn in all forms, including registration and all music and talent forms.
5. Counselors are to inspect the dorm area where you are staying before the campers leave for the first class.

All trash is to be picked up and trash cans dumped into the dumpster. Floors should be swept, beds should be made, and all clothing, suitcases, towels, swimming suits and shoes should be arranged in an orderly fashion.

6. Every year, money disappears out of the pool dressing rooms and the dorms. Arrangements should be made for counselors to assist their campers with their money and valuables while at camp.
7. We prefer that churches sit together in the chapel and that counselors sit with their groups. It is permissible to reserve seats for the entire camp week.
8. During the invitation, counselors should be ready to do personal work.
9. It is the responsibility of the counselors to make sure their campers are all in services, and that they are present for all events for which they have signed up.
10. When the time comes that the campers must be in the dorm, the counselors must make sure that all of their group is in and have devotions with them.
11. When the time comes for lights to be out, counselors should stay with their group and make sure that they go to sleep.
12. It is required that all campers be at morning devotions at 7:30 by the flagpole. Counselors must make sure their group is up and at this area on time.

13. Counselors should make sure that their campers are obeying the dress code. They should be instructed prior to camp on proper apparel and the difference between culottes and shorts. It is hard to expect the campers to wear the right thing if they don't have them at camp.

14. Adult counselors should observe the "two adults" rule. This requires that adults are never alone with children or youth without another adult present.

15. Adult volunteers should immediately report any behavior that seems abusive or otherwise inappropriate to their pastor.

16. The acceptable wearing of apparel for girls includes culottes. Culottes are not baggy pants or shorts but are made from a skirt pattern and should have a pleat in the front and a pleat in the back. Culottes should extend to below the knee. For a culottes pattern:

17. If there are any maintenance problems, please contact the camp director. We will try to get the problems fixed as soon as possible.

18. If our counselors will carry out their responsibilities, it will help our camp to be the kind of camp that will glorify the Lord and result in many souls saved and lives changed.

19. When addressing the counselors in this list of rules, we are including pastors, youth leaders, associates, and all other adults.

20. We strongly recommend that all counselors be approved by their pastor and:

a. that you be mindful of the ratio of your counselors vs. campers.

b. that you fill out the waiver of background checks in your camp packet.

21. At the close of camp, the grounds must be cleaned, dorms swept, trash put into the dumpster, and all personal items removed from the dorms. Please also see that all windows are closed, and the lights are turned out.

22. Before leaving camp, each church must be cleared by the registrar.

# SPORTS PROGRAM

**Philosophy:** To provide an opportunity for the young people to experience competition, fellowship, and activity together in a good Christian atmosphere.

## **Sports Rules:**

1. All participants must be of camp age.
2. A sports schedule will be posted throughout the camp.
3. Try to be at your event on time.
4. We encourage good sportsmanship.
5. Swimming pools are off limits, except when a lifeguard is on duty.

## SCRIPTURE MEMORY CHALLENGE

During the week, each camper will be given a Scripture memory workbook. The workbook contains every Bible verse for the week, with a space by each verse for counselor's initials. Once a camper has studied a verse and is confident that they have it memorized, they may recite the verse to a counselor. If the counselor feels that the camper has recited the verse satisfactorily, they will sign their initials beside the verse.

Points will be awarded for each verse that has been initialed by a counselor, with extra points given for any campers that have memorized all of the Scriptures. These points will be used to accumulate towards the camper's team score and can have a great impact on the result.

Each camper should take care to write their name and their team color on their memory workbook.

Points cannot be awarded without proof of the verses that have been memorized.

The Scriptures for memorization will be announced at camp.

## BIBLE QUIZ

### 2 TIMOTHY

The Bible quiz is a written test which all contestants will take in a specified location following lunch on Thursday. No talking or Bibles will be permitted during the quiz. Each person who wishes to take the Bible quiz should bring their own pencils.

# TALENT AND MUSIC RULES

## GENERAL RULES

1. Be respectful of those who are performing. Do not talk out loud and do not enter or leave the area of competition until the one who is performing is finished.
2. All music needs to be approved by your Pastor/Youth Director. If there are any questions, please contact Pastor Brandon Shull.
3. All music and talent contestants will be judged by three judges who are qualified in those areas. The decision of the judges is final.
4. When you perform for the Lord, it is essential that you present the best possible image. Our judges, therefore, will judge you for neatness, cleanliness, and for conformity to the camp dress code.
5. All contestants must be of camp age.
6. All entries for music and talent competition will have sign-up forms filled out and turned in at the time of registration by their counselor. If campers are not signed up at the time of registration, they will not be allowed to compete.
7. No “canned music” or tracks may be used in talent (including media), or in music competitions unless recorded by your own pianist in the sound of a piano. Please refrain from using a keyboard’s digital orchestra settings.

## TALENT RULES

1. No contestant may be entered more than 3 times in talent and may not participate more than one time per event.
2. Teaching and preaching will be limited to 5 minutes. Deductions will be given for going over this time.

## MUSIC RULES

1. All vocal competitors are expected to sing in the camp choir.
2. No contestant may be entered more than 3 times in piano or vocal competitions (excluding church choirs and camp choir).
3. No contestant may enter more than once in any event of competition.
4. During instrumental competition, the piano is considered accompaniment only, and is not included as an instrument.
5. All selections should be limited to no more than two verses.

# TALENT

**Introduction** – Should be heard and easily understood.

**Appearance** – Should be proper and neat. Contestants should dress their best when participating in the talent competition. Boys are encouraged to wear neckties.

**Enthusiasm** – Involves a genuine Godly motivation.

**Delivery** – Grammar – Words should be understandable.

**Fluency** – speaking smoothly, not choppy.

**Gestures** – proper use of hand gestures.

**Vocal Expression** – should vary in pitch, speed, volume, emphasis.

**Eye Contact** – should have a sense in which it involves the entire listening audience.

**Preparation** – Material should be well-known.

**Application** – Relating a Bible truth to our lives.

# MUSIC

Next to the preaching of God's Word, music plays an integral part in our worship of the Lord. Along with our congregational singing and the cherished all camp choir, we offer our campers the opportunity to present their musical talents in a competitive forum. As with any competition, there is a measure of focus on "winners" and "losers." This is not our focus in the music competition.

This area of competition is not to compare and reward the musical abilities of our campers, but to encourage and strengthen all our campers in their efforts of musical worship. Each camper will be judged against a standard of excellence and offered constructive criticism. Some of the areas in which they will be judged include:

**Personal** – includes the introduction of the song, appearance, posture, overall enthusiasm, and eye contact.

**Tone Production** – A tone consists of four distinct attributes:

Pitch – melodies

Length – rhythmic

Power – dynamics

Quality – esthetics (capacity for sensation)

**Facility** – includes the direction (for song leading), technique, articulation, rhythm, tempo, and memorization.

**Musicality** – Does the song inspire the congregation? What about phrasing/breathing, expressiveness, and dynamics? For songs using harmony, how is the blend?

Our ultimate goal is to sharpen the talents of our campers. We endeavor to foster their desire to sing and play music that glorifies the Lord. They will be surrounded by Godly music all week at camp and will hopefully return home to continue singing and playing.
